





### THE PLAYWRIGHT

Norman Foster is considered to be Canada's most produced playwright. Intrigued with the theatre, he set pen to paper in 1980 and wrote his first play titled *Sinners* which was a huge success. Since then, he has produced an astonishing output of work—over fifty-five plays in all.



Frequently compared to American playwright Neil

Simon, Foster's plays that are known for their humour, accessibility, and insight into the everyday life. *Hilda's Yard*, according to Foster is one of his favourites because each character is unique and charming and the plot unfolds in a hilarious and unexpected way. (cont'd. pg 4)

(cont'd from pg 3) About his plays, Foster says, "I think for the most part, they're about ordinary people just trying to get by in life." In 2016, he was awarded a lifetime membership in the Playwrights Guild of Canada and that same year he was named an Officer of the Order of Canada.

Penelope is delighted to have the opportunity to direct this play with St. Luke's Players Community Theatre. Previous productions include *Things My Mother Taught Me, Cliffhanger* and *Cakewalk*. She has directed many productions at Langham Court Theatre, Glenlyon-Norfolk School and The King's Head Theatre in London. She is the recipient of the William Wylie Award in Arts Administration from the Stratford Festival



### **DIRECTOR'S NOTES**

This story of the Fluck family is set in 1956. Sam and Hilda's children, Gary and Janey, have finally left home; their parents are set to enjoy their golden years, by buying a television set! Norm Foster says he based it on memories of his grandmother's house in Toronto.

Both children, catastrophes having taken over their lives, feel they have to return home to live. They are at a loss to understand why their parents aren't overjoyed to see them. What follows is the story of a family figuring out how to navigate this unexpected turn and stay united. Hilda and Sam are stretched to their limits as the children challenge them on difficult domestic issues. What was acceptable in the 1950s is not today—and it is interesting to see how these characters deal with their problems.

Much laughter and some tears ensue, as well as a shifting of attitudes—for all. It is a lovely story and it has been a privilege to steer this show to performance.


