Gary Ray Stapp's theatre experience began in grade school, when he was 10 years old. After performing in numerous high school and college productions, in 1991, he founded The Chamber Players Community Theatre in Garnet, Kansas. Twelve years later, Gary wrote his first play for that company. Audience response and the accolades that followed were unprecedented. Gary has been writing plays ever since. In 2007, he was named the Kansas Arts Commission winner for playwriting. In 2008, his play, "Fashionably Late", won The Funniest Play on Earth competition.

Gary's style is to mesh the art of one-liners with physical buffoonery, creating characters that are vivid and colorful.
