# From the Archives Celebrating our 60th Season

Following the formation of St. Luke's Players in 1949, their first play was produced in 1950. As well as productions in the church hall, there were several entries each year in various drama festivals on the Island, often with awards for the play or actors. Theatre runs were usually two nights but it wasn't long before Thursday, Friday and Saturday nights were established. It wasn't until 1975 that four nights became the norm. This continued until 1987 when it was proposed (actually it was me!) at a meeting that it seemed an awful lot of work for four performances and the run was extended to three nights the second week. Agatha Christie's *A Murder is Announced* didn't disappoint. Audiences came but it wasn't until November 1990 that Wednesday was added to the second week. Matinees were not included until 1996.

St. Luke's Players have an interesting archival box containing scrapbooks of the earlier years, which sadly are in a delicate condition now, but also there are photograph albums, old programs and lists of plays. Many names, now familiar with Langham Court, began their Victoria community theatre involvement with St. Luke's, and the most famous, Margaret Martin, first mentioned in 1951, turned professional and has had a distinguished career. Who could forget her Emily Carr in *The Wonder of it All*? She was last seen in Noel Coward's *Hay Fever* at the Chemainus Theatre Feb -April, 2008.
