For the coming season, we are pleased to report that our play selection committee is hard at work and will be announcing our 2013-14 season in May.



Preparations are well under way for *Casting for Murder*. As its title suggests, it is a murder mystery, and was written by Burnaby playwright, Elizabeth Elwood. Its setting will be familiar to Victoria audiences, as the action takes place on a small privately owned Gulf Island.

Angela Benson inherits a fortune when her Aunt Maud is murdered, but the killer is never found. Angela's acting career flourishes, but suspicion continues to cloud her life, even after her marriage to mystery writer, John Rutherford. As Angela prepares for the role of Amanda in Noel Coward's *Private Lives*, a young journalist uncovers some startling new evidence about the three-year-old murder, and John and Angela find themselves embroiled in a sinister play beyond the footlights when the cast assembles at their island.

Murder and suspense abound with bodies falling off cliffs, a violent storm, poisoned drinks and a savage stabbing! What more could you want?

The cast comprises: Elizabeth Brimacombe, Perry Burton, Luke Krayenhoff, Kathy Macovichuk, Kevin Rich, Deirdre Tipping and Drew Waveryn.

Tony Cain, new to St Luke's Players but not the Victoria theatre community, is directing this play. The production crew includes **Elizabeth Whitmarsh** as Stage Manager, and the set is designed by **Don Keith**.

These acts never cease to amaze me. It's certainly true that you never know what you can do until you try.

Moments like this were abundant during *Goldilocks and the 3 Bears*; from the many cast members, who had never acted before, to myself in my first role as director. Our stage manager, assistant stage manager, most of our tech crew and properties person were new to their jobs, and throughout the process we all learned what worked and what didn't work.

Even the returning actors experienced their own "outside the box" moments. The singing and dancing were more complicated this year than in the past but everyone rose to the challenge, putting in the time and effort to make the show a success. Our new dame needs a special mention. Chris Harris admirably filled this role for his first time, even to the point of committing to the application of red acrylic nails (raising many an eyebrow when he went out to the bars) and enduring false eyelashes. Brava Chris.

I want to thank our many supporters, both inside and outside the theatre community. I did things a little different this year and while this was met with some resistance, the show proved to be a success, enjoyed immensely by the sold out crowds. Ultimately these performances are for the families who come out with their kids to see the panto. A child who leaves with a laugh and a smile on their face is our proof that we've accomplished a job well done.
