After 2 sets of auditions, a brilliant producer and her email and social media campaigns, and many rewrites of the rehearsal schedule by the Stage Manager, we were ready to go with a full cast and crew for St. Luke's Players' first show of the season. Sort of.

Okay, not quite ready to go, but those we had cast started the process of creation. Rehearsals for The Twelve Pound Look were starting to look great and the cast of Wendy Cornock as Kate, Ada Guna as Lady Simms, Steve Eastman as Tombes and Carl Powell as Sir Harry were working well together. Meanwhile, the incomplete cast of Table Number 7 showed just how professional the talent at St. Luke's is. The cast of Ada Guna, Penny Pitcher, Heather Lee, Rosalind Coleman, Roland Wille, Colleen Davis, Joy Farrell, Trisha Tomkins and Lisa Jackson started rehearsals by doing their blocking and rehearsing with two invisible characters. Because Victoria is so alive with theatre, we had to compete with all the summer theatres for actors! When we finally cast Eric Grace as Major Pollock, he had a trip to Asia planned, so he had a few rehearsals before he left and 6 more when he got back before opening night. Finally, Nick Atkinson, was cast as Charles but was already doing a production up Island and couldn't join us until a month into rehearsals. All of the actors in these two shows were the best of the best!

We also had a revolving door on crew! Between Producer Bronwyn Taylor, our Stage Manager Paul Gillan and ASM Karen Coverett, they brilliantly recruited an amazing back stage crew extraordinaire - Heather Senkler, Faith, Elaine Lewis, Deb Taylor and our unbelievable props mistress Geli Bartlet found anything I asked for. She found antique typewriters, a presentation sword, a tobacco pouch with Wellingtonian colours, and a myriad of other things as well as helping back stage and being the Chef of the Beauregard Hotel in Bournemouth.

Our sets were designed by Barb Clerihue and skillfully built by Dave Hitchcock, Neville Owen and the St. Luke's set builders and painters.

Anne Swannell painted our scenic backgrounds and the portrait of Lady Simms. Max Terpstra designed the lighting and was assisted by Niko Batinovic. Newcomer Nicholas Miller took on the operating of the sound designed by Mitch Barnes.

The incredible costumes were the responsibility of Jane Kreiger and Madeleine Mills. Finally, there is Ann Harris. I have been honored to once again have her take on set decor. This is the fourth show that Ann has worked on with me. There is nothing she can't or won't do to make the sets perfect. On top of all that, she helped backstage for the run of the show.

The plays themselves were well received and I received many compliments on both plays. For all the trials and tribulations, the cast and crew came together as an amazing and professional team. Congratulations to all cast and crew!
