We are pleased to announce that the plays and directors have been selected for 2011-12. The season is announced later in the Newsletter. Thanks to the Play Reading Committee for taking on this task. It promises to be an exciting year with very talented directors for each show. We are lucky to have so much talent wanting to be a part of St Luke's Players.

Reflecting back on our 62<sup>nd</sup> Season, it has been a huge success with record attendances. Many thanks to all the folk who took part, both on and off stage. The addition of three more matinees was well received by our audiences and we will continue this format for next year. The offer of seat cushions has also helped with their comfort during the shows.


