Welcome to St. Luke's Players' 66<sup>th</sup> season. We are excited to be presenting *Steel Magnolias* in the fall (it is different from the movie, so don't think "I've seen it already").

To those who have renewed or become members and/or season ticket holders for the 2014-15 season, thank you! For those who haven't renewed their membership, please consider doing so for the princely sum of \$5.00 per year, as this is the last newsletter you will receive until you do. Newsletters include information on upcoming events, auditions, what members are involved with outside SLP, an invitation to our Annual General Meeting cum BBQ party, photos of casts and crews in action, and more. Season Ticket Holders receive a reduction of \$2.50 per show on our already very reasonable rates and the privilege of reserved seats in the first few rows the sooner you apply, the closer to the front are your seats. Steel Magnolias was written by Robert Harling, an aspiring actor, after his younger sister Susan died from diabetes in 1985. As her best friend and closest sibling, Harling found it difficult to cope with her death so his friends advised him to write about his feelings as a coping method. His writing began as a short story and evolved into the full-length play *Steel Magnolias,* that tells the story of six very special friends bonded together by mutual triumphs and tragedies. Sharing each other's strength and loyalty, these remarkable women survive the cycles of life, birth and death to emerge stronger, closer and still laughing. The play takes place in Truvy's beauty salon in the fictional town of Chinquapin, Louisiana where the six indomitable Southern women share their personal triumphs, tragedies, beauty tips, recipes, and more than the occasional piece of scandalous gossip.

The cakes are not edible, they are creations made with styrofoam blocks and shapes, cheese cloth, light glue, wall board paste and many more inedible accoutrements.

In Victoria, Ann worked on the set and also in props. She is an amazing woman who passionately tells her story of this play and how much she loved being involved.
