Staging a period piece such as *Victo-ria's House*, is always a challenge for community theatre costumers, set decorators and those responsible for procuring properties appropriate to the time. Many sound and lighting effects added to director **Jon Scheer's** artistic vision for the show. It was very well received by our audiences, some saying it is the best show we have ever done! This is all thanks to the excellent cast and hard-working crew that brought the show together.

Graham Thomson's last contribution to SLP before he passed away at the end of January was to design the wonderful set for *Victoria's House*. Donations to the Players in his name continue to come in. Our final show of the season runs May 20-31 and is the comedy/farce *Barely Heirs*, by David Lassig, directed by **Neville Owen** and **Sharon Sutherland**. Tickets go on sale April 20 at the usual outlets, and will be available at the door during the run.

It is becoming increasingly difficult to find enough volunteers for Front of House and Concession and I am not sure why, so if you have volunteered before and can do so again, why not enlist a friend to come with you for company and to learn the ropes? You will get a comp ticket to see the show on another night/afternoon so you won't miss out seeing the show be-

Please think about ordering Season Tickets for 2015-16. You will save over buying individually for each show, and have reserved seats in the front few rows. That way we can be sure to seat you with your friends.

Interestingly, this recent 2010 American play has been performed in BC at Armstrong and Keremeos to enthusiastic reviews.




Penny Pitcher has been busy with Target Theatre's recent fundraiser, *I'm Still There*, and in their upcoming comedies.



Opening Night

A comedy by Norm Foster Directed by Geoffrey J. Davidson (October 14 to 25, 2015)

Synopsis: The antics begin as Jack and Ruth Tisdale celebrate their 25th wedding anniversary with an evening at the theatre. It's a dream come true for Ruth and an imposition for Jack who would rather be at home watching the World Series. However, after the events both on and off the stage that fateful night, their lives and those of all involved are irreparably altered.

Mother Goose

A traditional panto by Sheila Coultish, Peggy Harris and Ian Matthews

Directed by Merry Hallsor & Dave Hitchcock (Dec 18, 2015 to Jan 2, 2016)

Synopsis: Mother Goose, her large family and their goose Priscilla are happy living in their big old boot, but the King's evil Chancellor plots to evict them all and take their land. Will his wicked plan succeed or will good triumph over bad?? This traditional Christmas pantomime tells the tale with singing, dancing and plenty of laughs along the way.

Cliffhanger

A comedy/thriller by James Yaffee Directed by Penelope Harwood (March 9 to 20, 2016)

Synopsis: Mingling suspense and humor, this ingeniously plotted thriller follows all the unexpected twists and turns which result when a seemingly mild-mannered professor of philosophy is driven to apparent murder to protect his reputation and career. Thereafter, as the professor and his wife plot a foolproof way to dispose of the body, complications arise in the form of a rather sinister young student who is about to flunk out of school (unless his grade is changed) and who happened to witness the professor's violent action.

Bull in a China Shop

A mystery/comedy by CB Gilford Directed by Michael King (May 18 to 29, 2016)

Synopsis: Six old ladies – presumed sweet until they prove otherwise – have a unique solution to the problem of getting that handsome homicide detective, Dennis O'Finn, to pay them a visit. You'll find that a nice genteel homicide, with a cup of tea as the murder weapon, is all it takes. However, when Detective O'Finn discovers he's the motive for this murder, and he decides to distance himself from the ladies, what are the sweet dears to do?

Preliminary Panto Preparations Proceed

To all of you lovers of panto, this is a (very, very) early warning that preparations for this year's *Mother Goose* have already begun.

"Oh no, they haven't "Oh yes, they have!"

The script is being adapted for our local audiences, suitable songs selected, and the production team assembled.

Actors will be able to audition in the middle of September (stay tuned for dates and times!) for a variety of interesting roles, including Mother Goose (the Dame), her children (nursery rhyme characters), Priscilla (the goose), Jack (Principal Boy), Jill (his twin sister), Old King Cole, Queen Cole, Princess Connie Cole, Fairy Good Heart and Pom Pom (her apprentice), not forgetting the evil Chancellor and his bumbling henchman.

So, if you are a seasoned panto performer, an actor who has never been in a panto before or someone who simply enjoyed watching a previous panto, please consider auditioning in September. We will be looking for actors of all ages (8 to 80!) and experience (none to lots!) who want to be part of this annual tradition at St Luke's. Please help to spread the word.

Copies of the script will be available in a couple of months, but to be sure of receiving yours, or if you have questions, please contact us at any time.

Rehearsals will start in September and performances run from December 18 to January 2.
