SET BUILDERS WANTED By Dave Hitchcock

Have you ever wondered how the sets at St Luke's are created and what it might be like to help build them?

Here are some Q & A's that might give you some idea:

When does it happen?

- Normally we start set building about two months before the performance dates for each of the 4 productions in a season, pretty well at the same time as rehearsals begin
- Sometimes we finish the building before the set painters move in, sometimes we work (amicably) together at the same time. It depends!
- Set building takes place
 3 times a week:
 Sunday afternoons,
 Tuesday afternoons and
 Friday mornings
- Typically 3-hour sessions
- A schedule is produced for each production

Do I have the time?

 Some folks attend every set building session, some come on the same day (or days) each week, while others



turn up when they can this is entirely up to you, especially if you are working (at a real job) or have other commitments!

• Some join us after the start of a morning or afternoon session, others sometimes have to leave early—we're totally flexible!

Do I need specific skills?

 It's probably fair to say that none of us are: "carpenters", at least l'm not!

- There is currently a wide range of skills, abilities and interests and always something for everyone to do
- We're open to new ideas about how to do stuff
- Maybe you are interested in painting the sets (walls, trim or even scenic scenes for backdrops?). A Set Décor person is in charge of the Painters
- Remember a stage set has to look good from the audience perspective (20 feet away) and be able to come

apart (at the strike) in a few hours. So we build and paint accordingly!

What is needed from me?

- Satisfaction in working towards a common goal — the finished set!
- Enjoy working with others
- A sense of humour and wish to have fun

Do I have the agility or physical stamina?

- That's up to you to decide!
- Folks come when they want or can

- There are no age restrictions
- Many of us have "limitations" (such as some being uncomfortable up a ladder or using certain power tools), so we share the tasks, depending on what you are happy doing.

What else do I need to know?

- The current group is a fun-loving bunch
- We invite, encourage and welcome "fresh blood" to join us and look forward to showing newcomers what we do and how we do it. You'll soon fit in! Maybe there's something that you can show us (there probably is!)—we're none of us too old to learn!
- We always have a "tea break", with tea, coffee, cookies and other goodies —a time to focus on socializing, although a lot of this happens while we are building, too!
