PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE



Since the last newsletter The Players have been busy: concluding our first show of the 2022-23 season to great acclaim; sponsoring a 'Readers Theatre Workshop'; donating 2 Season

Tickets to the BC Pension Corp silent auction and 2 to the Church Bazaar: helping at the Bazaar with set-up in advance, donations, or help on the day; auditioning our March show; turning back our clocks to Standard Time: and rehearsing the always popular Christmas Panto.

The Play Selection Committee is hard at work reading and recommending plays for the 2023–24 season, as well as for 2024–25. We try to work a year in advance of requirements in order to attract enthusiastic directors, but this fell apart during Covid, hence the need for 2 seasons at once. If you have a play you would like to see SLPCT perform,

please send the title and playwright to ronrubin3491@gmail.com for the Committee's consideration.

At the fall show we used "The Square" which allowed patrons to purchase tickets at the door using debit or credit cards. During week 1 it didn't always work as hoped; by week 2 most of the glitches had been resolved, so we should be able to continue to offer this option for future shows.

As we pay a fee on tickets purchased this way, we still prefer cash or cheques, but patron convenience is one of the ways we need to move forward in this age of technology and convenience, as well as encouraging younger people, who seldom use cash, to join our audiences.

Many of our volunteers are at the age/ stage where they are no longer able to do some of what they did before, such as running up and down ladders or devoting as much time to projects as in the past, so we need to find ways to bring on new and younger volunteers.

Young retirees are ideal, as most of our work times are during the day, but we do have Sunday afternoons for those still working. The same goes for many of our volunteer crew positionswithout these people our shows would not go on.

So, if you know of any younger people with an interest in things theatrical, please encourage them to get involved. There is a very comprehensive Production Guide on the website under the Get Involved tab that will give them an idea of what is available:




