


Jean de Cartier looked after properties and décor for *Silent Sky* at LCT. It is a wonderful production that runs January 25th to February 11th.

After some thought, she remembered co-directing Robin Hood in Basel, Switzerland 24 years ago. She figures

this must have been the 4th panto she helped introduce to Switzerland through volunteering as co-director and stage manager.

From production team minutes, it's clear she also helped write the script (which was considerably more risqué than SLP's!) But, as her "real life" was consumed with managing international research into the first medication ever developed for cystic fibrosis, she didn't record in her long-term memory



what she did for simple fun.

Rehearsals were held in the back room of a pub (which

they each paid for by buying their own supper and/or beer) with additional space in the basement of Basel University Hospital which, because it was held in reserve for medical emergencies, could accommodate temporary users like them. Looking back, the whole enterprise was resoundingly amateur "town hall" community theatre whose only possible


justification was fun, and she still loves doing that!
