


## Coming Soon! Oct 4-15



2023 marks the 45th year of the Ukrainian Canadian Cultural Society of Vancouver Island in Victoria.

To mark the occasion, we are planning a concert featuring professional Ukrainian newcomer musicians and local Ukrainian Canadian artists on the 14th or 15th of October. A venue is yet to be confirmed.

So far, on Vancouver Island we have helped settle and support over 1300 newcomers displaced by war in Ukraine. At this point we are hoping to make it a free concert with perhaps a donation opportunity and open it up to the general community as well.

It has been a very busy year plus for our Ukrainian community and there have been many fundraising events to support newcomers and Ukraine.

## The impact of war in Ukraine has broken the hearts of all communities across Canada.


We feel the anguish and sorrow of Ukraine and her people but have been encouraged by the unity and camaraderie of supporters across cultures.

The beautiful Kokum scarf is a historical symbol of strength, friendship, unity and respect. In Ukrainian the scarf is called

a hustka or in Canada, babushka meaning Grandmother.

Ukrainian settlers came primarily to the prairies. They were excellent farmers and courted by the government to break new land for feeding the growing nation. They were looked down upon by other European settlers but welcomed and aided by First Nations. The story goes that the scarves were gifted by Ukrainians to Indigenous Peoples to thank them for guidance, help and medicines that were shared with the settlers. The Kokum scarf has been incorporated into First Nations cultures across Canada and is worn as a sign of solidarity and historic relationship.

It also represents the fact that we are all connected!
