work that connects with audiences.


Karmen is known for a collaborative approach that values every voice in the room, and for creating rehearsal spaces where artists feel welcome, supported, and inspired to take creative risks.



It is only resolved when one deranged lady sets fire to her room.

Auditions will be held in one hour long blocks with a maximum of six auditioners per block. Those wishing to audition will be required to book a slot.

Auditions will consist of cold readings to 14 and March 18 to 21, matinees from the script plus solo singing of the song "Champagne", a song which appears in Act III, Scene 1 of the play.

Rehearsals are scheduled evenings from 7:00 to 10:00 on Mondays, Wednesdays and Fridays beginning January 7.

Performances are evenings March 11 on March 14, 15, 21, and 22 plus a preview performance on the evening of March 9.




